

6 – 8 May 2025 | New York

### Strategic Foresight at the STI Forum 2025



The 2025 Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI) Forum will be held on 7 - 8 May at UN Headquarters in New York and broadcasted virtually, kicked off by an [STI Action Day](#) on 6 May. Sessions will explore the [Global Digital Compact](#), artificial intelligence, gender equality in STEM, ocean conservation, STI capacity building and financing, and more. A dynamic lineup of [in-person](#), [off-site](#), and [virtual](#) side events will offer opportunities for engagement, networking, and collaboration on innovative solutions for sustainable development.

This year, strategic foresight will contribute to the broader goals of the STI Forum, by highlighting its value in advancing science, technology, and innovation for sustainable development. During the Action Day on 6 May, the [UN Futures Lab/Global Hub](#) and the [International Science Council \(ISC\)](#) will co-host a side event to launch a joint report that spotlights applications of futures thinking from the Global South ([Register here](#)). On 7 May a [side event](#), co-hosted by the [UN Futures Lab/Global Hub](#) and [UN DESA](#), will feature a discussion and live demonstration of how digital capabilities are being used to consolidate and analyze insights from horizon scanning initiatives across the UN system.

### Turning Youth Insights into Sustainable Action for Future Generations






**GOVERNANCE FUTURES:  
KEY INSIGHTS AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

**Abstract:** Governance systems at the global, national, and local levels are at a critical juncture. As the world grows more volatile, uncertain, complex, and ambiguous, there is a growing belief that they are unfit to effectively address both present and future challenges, as well as meet people's needs and new aspiration. How governments together with other stakeholders prepare for the future will significantly impact people's well-being, both now and in the years to come. This Policy Brief outlines how strategic foresight can help governments reimagine governance models that are better equipped to address current complex challenges and capitalize on emerging opportunities. It does so by examining key drivers of change across the political, economic, social, technological, and environmental spheres—and how these issues and their interlinkages may shape governance systems by 2040. Using strategic foresight, the Policy Brief aims to deepen our understanding of the complex dynamics shaping the future of governance and provides insights into potential pathways for transformational change to enable the design of forward-looking, anticipatory policies.

Governance systems around the world are under increasing strain as they confront a landscape marked by volatility, uncertainty, and rising public expectations. The latest [United Nations Economist Network](#) (UNEN)'s Policy Brief explores how existing systems may be falling short - and how strategic foresight can help reimagine governance models that are more adaptive, inclusive, and fit for the future. By examining key drivers of change across political, economic, social, technological, and environmental dimensions, the brief offers insights into how governance could evolve by 2040 and outlines potential pathways for transformational change.

### Youth Foresight Fellowship



The 2025 UNICEF Innocenti Youth Foresight Fellowship has officially launched—marking the third cohort of this growing initiative that puts youth at the centre of anticipatory research, advocacy, and global dialogue. Building on a strong foundation, this year's Youth Foresight Fellows from across Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and North America will explore the futures of education. Previous cohorts have co-developed *Our Future Pledge: An Agenda for Futures by Youth, the Meaningful Youth Engagement Principles*, and the *Child Rights Youth Foresight Report*, advancing youth-driven foresight at both global and national levels. Bringing expertise in digital literacy, STEM, gender equality, teaching, advocacy, peacebuilding, and more, they will lead participatory foresight research in their countries over the next eight months. Their work will contribute to key initiatives such as flagship reports and the *Leading Minds Conference* on the Future of Education in Africa.

The [United Nations Department of Safety and Security \(UNDSS\)](#)'s Strategic Planning Unit has released a new [Strategic Foresight Brief](#) examining the evolving threat of Non-State Armed Groups (NSAGs). It explores current dynamics and future trajectories, including how NSAGs control humanitarian access, use hybrid warfare, and adopt technologies like 3D printing. The brief also highlights their use of the dark web for recruitment, propaganda, and cybercrime. Drawing from these insights, the brief outlines the potential implications for global security as well as security for the United Nations and proposes forward-looking strategies for how UNDSS can proactively prepare for and respond to these emerging challenges.


