We also feature key developments shaping long-term thinking across the system – from Member States reaffirming their commitment to future generations at a [High-Level Political Forum \(HLPF\) 2025 Side Event](#) to the recently published [UN Global Risk Report's](#) four foresight scenarios that challenge us to make deliberate choices for a more equitable, resilient future. These are complemented by resources that spotlight environmental tipping points as well as the practical application of foresight tools, such as the Futures Triangle, to strengthen digital public services in Central Asia.

Over two engaging webinars, the UN Strategic Foresight Community of Practice explored [UN 2.0 Week “Foresight Day”](#) and the role of foresight in driving transformation across the system. Showcasing initiatives from over 15 UN entities and partners, Part 1 highlighted how inclusive, feminist, equity-driven futures and applied foresight in complex systems, institutional innovation and programmatic shifts, are being embedded into real-world programming, planning, and decision-making. Part 2 created space for deeper discussion and reflection to unpack the challenges, lessons, and opportunities for scaling foresight across policy and operations, resulting in valuable insights into how foresight is being operationalized in complex contexts.

In 2024 at the [Summit of the Future](#) in New York, Member States adopted the [Declaration on Future Generations](#), laying out commitments for both Member States and the UN to safeguard the interests of generations and to place a long-term vision at the heart of the work of the multilateral system. In support of the Declaration, the Executive Office of the Secretary-General (EOSG) and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) brought Member States, the UN, and civil society together to share best practices for innovative, long-term governance mechanisms, and contribute to improving long-term planning and SDGs implementation. Featuring insights from the European Commission, Jamaica, the Netherlands, and Nigeria, along with youth representatives from Brazil and Germany, the side event focused on enhanced cooperation to support foresight for future generations and its integration into policymaking.

"UN Global Risk Report 2024"



The recently released [UN Global Risk Report 2024](#) identifies which risks are most important and for which risks the multilateral system is least prepared. The report then considers which actions would most help address these Global Vulnerabilities and how to overcome barriers to action. Produced by the [Executive Office of the Secretary-General](#) (EOSG), the report features four foresight scenarios developed by the [UN Futures Lab/Global Hub](#). The scenarios connect perceptions, actions, and possible outcomes to help decision-makers explore how the future may evolve and prepare not for one but multiple possibilities. The four scenarios – Breakdown, Status Quo, Progress, and Breakthrough – illustrate how more or less joint multilateral action could impact each of the Global Vulnerabilities by 2050. The stark differences between these possible futures highlight a critical choice: choose breakdown, maintain the status quo, make incremental progress, or break through to a more prosperous, greener and safer world for current and future generations?




UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP)

“Futures triangle and causal layered analysis of the digital public services for small and medium-sized enterprises in Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan”



These papers present key insights from foresight workshops conducted by the [UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia Pacific \(ESCAP\)](#) in December 2024 and March 2025 on the future of digital public services for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) in Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan. Using foresight techniques such as the futures triangle, change progression scenario method, and causal layered analysis, the workshops brought together diverse stakeholders to analyze the current state of digital public services and explore future scenarios. Participants defined critical challenges, drivers of change, and potential digital public service delivery models for SMEs. These include identifying historical barriers, current trends, and future aspirations for digital public services.
